Objectives	This course is designed for intermediate students to develop authentic reading and writing skills to prepare students for academic work in English. It focuses on understanding reading exercises, improving vocabulary and study skills. Writing research reviews paragraphs and focuses on the use of formal English grammar alongside article writing. Course Objectives; Reading / Writing Analyzing the author's point of view by making inferences Determining the meaning of increasingly complex texts using contextual clues Using background words and linguistic and contextual clues to make sense of unknown words Making general conclusions from specific details in a text Writing compositions with a clear introduction, supporting details and conclusion Writing abstracts and explanations of reading texts Student Learning Outcomes: Using syntactic clues to interpret the meaning of complex sentences or new words Finding information using reference tools, including online resources Adjusting the reading strategy as measured by reading responses, reading tests and quizzes by tracking what you read.

Can write an effective thesis statement. Can use pre-writing strategies to plan writing. Generate ideas from sources to develop content. Develop content and support consistent with relevant details Can write an explanatory academic article of 4/5 paragraphs. He can write a 500-word response to an interesting reading. Can give critical feedback. Can use feedback to edit posts. Can use various correct sentence structures. Can use grammatical structures correctly. Can use digital literacy tools to improve writing and grammar skills. Can reflect on learning and performance, evaluate and set goals for progress. Be able to show behaviors and attitudes appropriate to the university environment (working together, managing time, being prepared, obeying the rules of academic integrity)
