Objectives	This course aims to analyze the fundamental issues in Turkish foreign policy after the end of the Cold War. International conjuncture, regional developments as well as changes in Turkish political and economic system have radically influenced the state of affairs in Turkish foreign policy. 9/11 attacks, US occupations, changes and transformations in the Middle East, search for new identity have led to the emergence of an heavy agenda in Turkish foreign policy. In this course, the current state of Turkish foreign policy will be analyzed through different conceptual approaches.				
Content	The main issues to be addressed are: 1) How did the changes in the global system affect Turkish foreign policy? 2) Which new identities and role models has begun to adopt by Turkey in recent years? 3) How does the political economy affect Turkish foreign policy? 4) Is there an axis shift in Turkish foreign policy? 5) How do Ottoman history and religion affect the International Relations of Turkey? 6) To what extent does Turkey benefit from the elements of soft power? 7) How to explain Turkey's new regional initiatives? 8) What are the roles of nongovernmental actors in Turkish foreign policy? 9) What are the elements of change /continuity in Turkish Foreign Policy? 10) Does Turkey regarded as a regional power? 11) What are the main challenges of Turkish foreign policy.
