Objectives	The course aims to introduce students to the complexity of world politics in the 21st century. "International relations" deals with the external relations of the states (foreign policy), the relations between the states (international politics) and the societies in different states (transnational politics). The main topics are international order and institutions, conflict and cooperation, integration, fragmentation and state change, regionalization and globalization.									
Content	This course provides a general introduction to the political history of the past 500 years, particularly through its focus on European politics and its influences on world politics in these centuries. The aim is to familiarize the students with the most important state actors, political and diplomatic representatives and processes of world history transformation. Several discussions of the wars and peace treaties will also make it possible to gain a further look at world politics in the sense of its past.
