It will be shown that, beyond theory, constitutional courts are (also) specialized courts and specialized courts are also constitutional courts. This applies to both substantive law and procedural law, and to varying degrees to all areas of law. In the first sessions, the conceptual and systematic foundations of the semester topic will be dealt with. The following lectures will discuss the outlined problems particularly in the context of criminal and civil law among others.
