Objectives		Understanding Diplomacy Law through international treaties and practice and its role in interstate relations				
Content		Diplomatic Law, a sub-branch of the International Public Law, plays an important role in interstate relations and forms the basis for all other branches of international law. Examining the relationship between international law and diplomacy is crucial for understanding how international law norms are applied in relations between sovereign states. The course consists of two parts: theoretical and practical. In the theoretical part, the establishment and management of diplomatic relations, the legal position of Heads of State, Heads of Government, ministers and diplomatic agents, diplomatic missions and their functions, diplomatic immunities and privileges, and diplomatic sanctions will be examined. In the practical part of the course, case studies taken from current developments will be discussed in light of relevant legislation, jurisprudence, and state practices.
